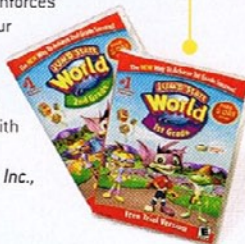


Giggles Computer Funtime for Baby: ABCs & 123s

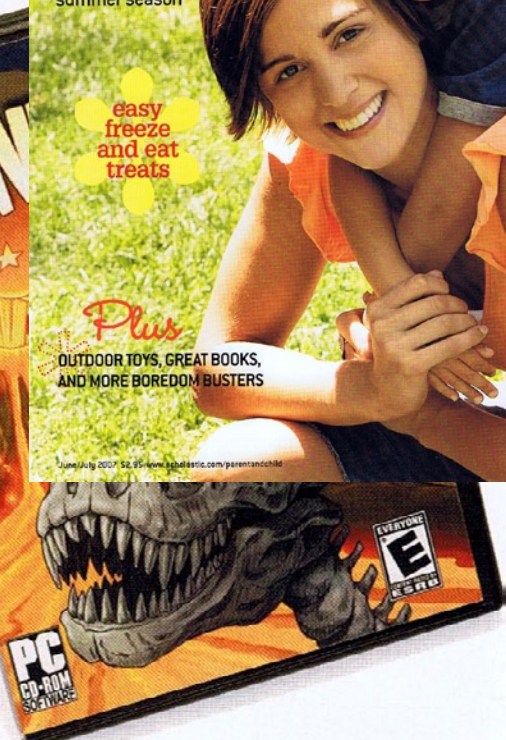
Strawberry Shortcake Strawberry Land Games
